Some of the topics discussed were:

• Succession Planning: harnessing the knowledge and expertise from one generation and growing on that to build a more successful company. Ways to create buy sell agreements.

- Business Planning: Identifying your SWOT Analysis, creating a marketing plan, organizational development plan and walking away with a Plan of Action.
- Technology in the workplace, new systems that streamline your business.

Scaturro, who has been employed by his family's business, Alpine Painting, since he was 15, recognized there are different challenges that may be encountered when starting out. "Family businesses are especially challenging because past history and emotions enter into the working relationship," he said.
